# Video Opener

## Teaching Toolbox from UCSC

“Strategies for Increasing Active Learning in Lecture Courses.”

- **Openers** are conducted near the beginning of a class session. Used to preview main points, orient participants, introduce participants to one another, establish ground rules, break the ice, set goals, or provide material for later discussion.
- Studies have shown that pausing every 12-18 minutes during a lecture for some kind of activity increases students' understanding and retention of material presented.

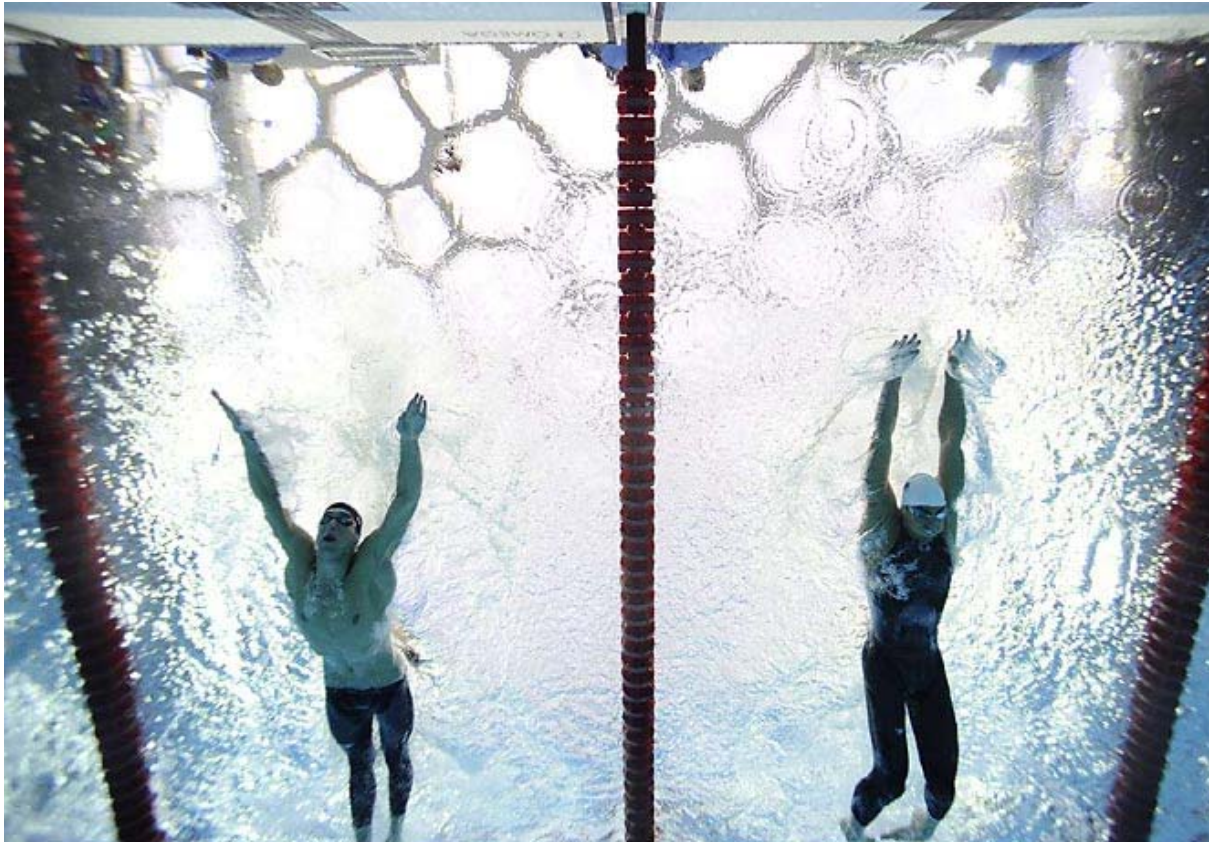
# OK, a *little* how-to...

- [Embed Video into PowerPoint](#) video
- **Embed YouTube Video into PowerPoint 2007**
- **The Easy Way**
  - Copy URL into PowerPoint
  - Right Click
  - Edit Hyperlink (write the text you want to display)
  - OK
  - Active link when you *present* Slide Show
  - Control + W to **close link** and continue Slide Show
